Care of the Confused (Dementia)

Dementia is a serious illness that requires much help from a person's friends, family and carer to manage.

As people live longer, and as the baby boom"generation ages, dementia is increasingly likely to affect us directly or indirectly at some point in our lives.

The purpose of this course is to help provide an introduction to some common aspects of dementia. While research is progressing to understand the causes of dementia and to develop more effective treatments, it remains a significant challenge for us to deal with.



Course Content

The course covers the following topics:

- *Attitudes towards people with Dementia*
- *What it might be like to experience dementia and the impact dementia has on others*
- *Causes, signs and symptoms of Dementia*
- *Helping people with dementia retain their independence and skills, for as long as possible*
- *Communication with other care workers, people with dementia, their families*

The course contains group exercises where carers can discuss medical conditions they deal with and strategies used to give appropriate care.



Course Instructors

Our instructors are nurse trainers and Diploma assessors and have extensive experience in their field.
