Optional Units

- Contribute to care planning and review
- Contribute to planning, monitoring & reviewing the delivery of service for individuals.
- Support individuals to access and use services & facilities
- Support individuals to develop & maintain social networks & relationships
- Support the social, emotional & identity needs of individuals
- Prepare your family & networks to support individuals requiring care
- Provide a home & family environment for individuals.
- Contribute to the protection of individuals from harm and abuse
- Contribute to the prevention & management of abusive & aggressive behaviour
- Provide frameworks to help individuals to manage challenging behaviour
- Carry out assessment to identify & prioritise needs
- Support individuals to live at home
- Support individuals to manage their

- Plan, agree & implement development activities to meet individuals needs
- Support individuals to continue therapies
